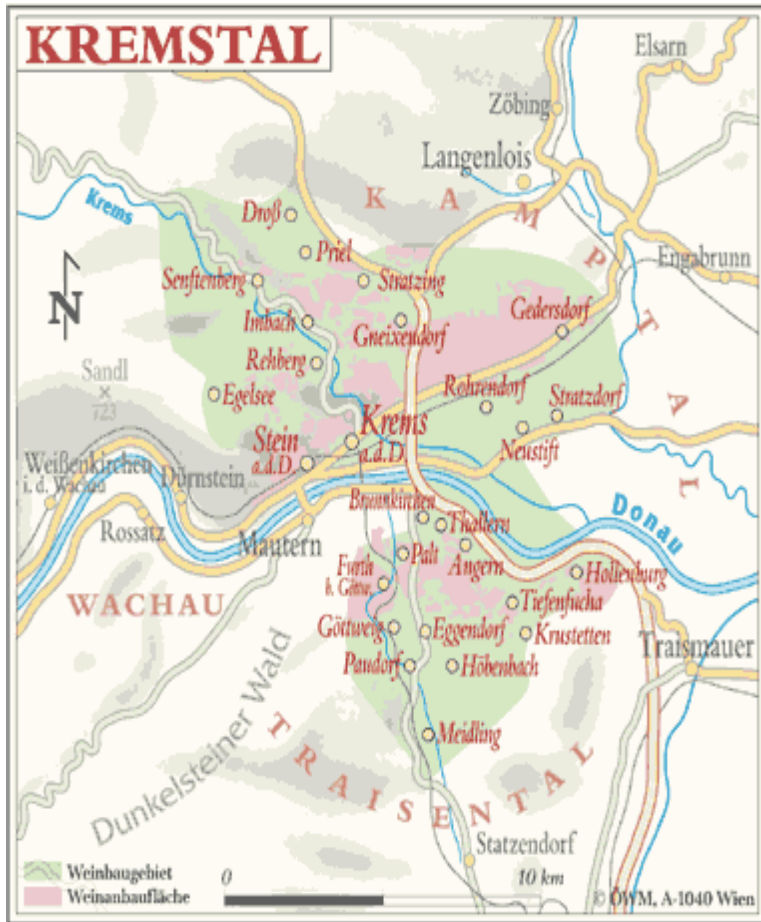


Lower Austria / Niederösterreich: Kremstal DAC



Size & Location: 2,200 ha/5,400 acres. Part of the old Kamptal-Donauland region. Situated to the northeast of Wachau and to the south of Kamptal centered on the town of Krets and Stein.

Important Villages: Krets and Stein.

Soil Types: Clay and limestone in the East. Rocky soil in the slopes near Wachau. Massive terraces of loess in the villages of Rohrendorf and Gledersdorf towards Kamptal.

Varietals & Style: Known for dense and spicy Grüner Veltliner and fragrant Riesling with stone fruit aromas and crisp minerality. Other wines include Zweigelt, Chardonnay, Cabernet Sauvignon and Pinot Noir.

Climate: Similar to the Wachau. Cool humidity from the nearby Waldviertel (Forest Quarter) meets the dry warmth coming over from the Pannonian plain to the east creating a temperature-regulating system.

Important Facts:

- Kremstal is divided into two wine districts:
 1. Stadt Krets- the eastern-lying areas north of the Danube
 2. Wine villages south of the Danube.
- **Producers of Note:** Nigl, Malat, Sepp Moser, Undolf-Salomon, Weingut der Stadt Krets, Buchegger, Mantler, and Angerer. The largest producer is Winzer Krets.
