

Burgenland: Südburgenland



Size & Location: 600 ha/1,476 acres. The smallest district in Burgenland located in the southernmost part of the region between Styria and Mittelburgenland with Hungary as the eastern border.

Important Villages: Deutsch Schutzen, Rechnitz, Moschendorf, and Heiligenbrunn.

Soil Types: Sandy, clay soils rich in iron and minerals.

Varietals & Style: Blaufränkisch from Eisenberg is the most important varietal. Welschriesling, Pinot Blanc, Pinot Gris and other fresh and fruity whites are also popular.

Climate: Pannonian climate, hot, dry summers and cold winters. Eisenberg - Area is shaped like a cauldron making it a partially warm area catching the heat from the south.

Important Facts

- **Uhudler Wine** - Made in the villages of Moschendorf, and Heiligenbrunn from a wide range of American Hybrids.
- Most of the wineries are run by part-time wine-growers; there are only a few large wine estates.
