

Lower Austria / Niederösterreich: Traisental DAC



Size & Location: 800 ha/1,968 acres. Austria's smallest wine district.

Important Villages: Traismauer and Herzogenburg,

Soil Types: River bank vineyards. **Right Bank** - clay and limestone. **Left Bank** - Dry and very limy gravel soils.

Varietals & Style: Grüner Veltliner is cultivated on 63% of the district. Riesling is the second most important varietal. Wines from the Right bank are soft and much broader than the left bank. Left Bank wines are racy and mineral driven, very similar to the style of Wachau.

Climate: Pannonian climate - warm days and cool nights

Important Facts

- Vineyards are situated on both sides of the Traisen river.
- Formerly the southwestern half of Kamptal-Donauland, a former district in Lower Austria that was split into 4 districts.
- Traisental became an appellation in 1994.
